

PROFILE OF PASTOR EHIOGHAE

Pastor (Prof) Efe Ehioghae is a professor of Christian Theology and Ethics with over 30 years ministerial experience. He has over 60 publications to his credit, amongst which is a book, **Godliness is Great Gain**.

Before his current appointment, he had served both as acting (2004- 2006) and substantive Head of the Religious Studies Department (2013 -2019). mum Academic Standards (BMAS) for the National Universities Commission for BA Theology Program and member, NUC Accreditation Exercise Panel, Ekiti State University, Ado-Ekiti.
