SVP FLAGS OFF ACADEMIC WRITING WORKSHOP

The department of Political Science and Public Administration last week put together a two-day workshop to improve the competence of faculty members in academic project writing.

The workshop, which took place at the Professor Zac Olomojobi Law Library Complex, was flagged off by the Senior Vice President, Academics, Professor

Philemon Amanze.

Professor Amanze commended both the Dean of Veronica Adeleke School of Social Sciences and the department's head for the laudable initiative to better equip faculty members in supervision of undergraduate and postgraduates projects.

While challenging attendees to make the best use of the opportunity, Professor Amanze added that the end product of the workshop was to make them efficient supervisors, writers and

publishers.

Head of department, Dr. Ngozi Ngogwugwu explained that the theme of the workshop, **Research and Academic Writing** was informed by the need to improve the capacity of faculty members to engage in quality research and publishing in Category 'A' journals.

Dr. Nwogwugwu said he expected to see a massive improvement of supervision, research, and quality publications generated by faculty members.

RIIC DIRECTOR URGES FACULTY TO RESEARCH WITH BU VISION

The director of Research, Innovation and International Cooperation, (RIIC) Prof Grace Tayo has called on faculty members to reciprocate administration’s support for research to improve their research output.

Delivering a keynote address at the opening of a two -day research and academic writing workshop organized by the department of Political Science and Public Administration, Prof Tayo said it was only by increasing research output that the University’s ranking can im-

prove. She urged the participants to always work towards ensuring the publication of their research findings as it increases the visibility of the researcher’s university ,thereby promoting networking, collaborations and increased enrollment.

“We need to study the indices used in ranking to improve our research output and build capacity in research”, she said.

She enjoined the partici-

pants to use the knowledge from the training not only to train students in excellent research writing but also to put Babcock University on the global map with their research findings. She said Babcock University was doing a lot for her faculty members in terms of institutional support for faculty research capacity as shown by the recent survey carried out by the Babcock University Research Council.

She commended the department for the workshop, noting that capacity building in research such as this would help the teachers to be equipped not only to train students but also to be inspired to impart the world positively .”

Speaking while declaring the training open, Professor Haliso said the training would further boost the department’s drive to deliver quality services to the University.

Professor Haliso, who represented the President/ Vice Chancellor, Prof Ademola Tayo at the ceremony , said since ‘water is life and a gift from the Giver’, one can imagine how much pain one would feel if water was wasted.

He thanked the Associate Vice President, Works and Physical Planning, Prof Adelere Adeniran for the innovative ideas he had brought to the department and putting the training together.

Also speaking , Prof Adeniran urged the participants to pay attention and take note of all that they are taught.

He said the essence of the training was for them to learn more and have better ideas on how to manage water distribution channels economically, as nobody could tell when and where it would be useful.

The training facilitator, Engr. Shade Ad-

emokoya said the goal of the two-day training was to define the methodologies and tools for the restructuring of Babcock water system network. The training focused on water distribution designs, costing and construction using EPANET software.

The engineers in Facility Management and Physical Planning units were the main participants.


