TEAM BU BAGS 2 GOLD MEDALS AT 2017 NPUGA

Against all odds, Team Babcock brought home two gold, nine silver and 17 bronze medals as 35 tertiary institutions met for the Nigeria Private Universities Games (NPUGA).

The week-long event held at the Nile University of Nigeria, Abuja had the Team BU participating in nine events including Tennis, Table Tennis, Basketball Badminton and Football.

Director of Student Activities and Team Coordinator, Dr Wole Oyerinde attributed this year’s performance to poor officiating and the team’s non-participation in games scheduled on Sabbath.

He said the absence of medals in the male Football was due to its cancellation
