President/Vice Chancellor, Professor Ademola S. Tayo who led officers to top up official vehicles, reiterated that the project's objective is to ensure quality control beyond cost saving.

The occasion also provided a platform to appreciate all project stakeholders just as he counseled on transparency and integrity in fund management.

"Any money you take that is not yours has repercussion; if not immediate but in the future." he said.

He enjoined the fuel attendants to also take necessary safety precautions to avoid

fire incidence, noting that the project symbolized greater things for the University and the contractor, Amos Afolabi Petroleum Limited, Lagos.

ABUS PRESIDENT PRESENTS SCORE CARD

The newly inaugurated President of the Association of Babcock University Staff (ABUS), Mr. Solomon Obida last week presented an account of his stewardship.

Obida said under his administration, the Association acquired plots of land for itself and members as well as continued welfare schemes for members.

He said while he inherited N3.89 million at the inception, he was handing over N9.1 million without any in-

debtedness.

Similarly, a total of N17.5 million making 79.5% of the N22 million acquired as loan from the Babcock Cooperative for the ABUS land purchase has been repaid.

Meanwhile, the N6.4million balance was still to be deducted from beneficiaries' account.

The Director of Legal Services, Mr. Niyi Arije administered the oath of allegiance on the new executives as Prof. Ademola S. Tayo offered the dedicatory prayer.

BABCOCK HOSTS MUSHROOM TRAINING PROGRAMME

he University took further steps to strengthen its agricultural capital gains with a one-day training on mushroom cultivation.

Twenty-one participants attended the programme held in collaboration with the Mushroom Development Foundation Nigeria at the University's main campus extension.

President/Vice Chancellor, Professor Ademola S. Tayo who declared the event open, said mushroom cultivation has high returns on investment because of the minimal capital required for cultivation.

"I want to encourage you to pay attention and study diligently during the training," he said.

According to him, participants stood to gain given the global demand for mushroom and a ready market within Babcock community. In the event of excess production, the Mushroom Development Foundation was ready to buy off the

mushroom. President, Mushroom Development Foundation Nigeria, Mrs. ChiTola Agbaje urged participants to go into mushroom cultivation because of its simplicity in cultivation.

Facilitator, Mr. Valentine Travib said temperatures were also essential in determining which mushrooms to grow and how they perform.

He said gourmet mushroom varieties like oyster and shiitake fetch high prices and are actually relatively simple to grow.

Meanwhile, the Chair of the Babcock University Agroentrepreneurship Centre, Professor Grace Tayo said apart from the simplicity, the training was organized to help more Nigerians embrace mushroom cultivation and grow their own businesses.

Prof. Dora AKINBOYE: A Professor of Public Health with expertise in Entomology, Microbiology, Parasitology, Akinboye is a purpose-driven individual. In her role as the Chair of the Babcock University Health Research Ethics Committee (BUHREC), she ensures that ethical standards are maintained in research through collaboration with other faculty and staff.

Prof. Yetunde MAKINDE: Professor of Nutrition and Dietetics with a passion for entrepreneurship and business development. These have enhanced her performance as the GMD for the Babcock Investment Group.
