

## PASTOR ANDRE MAKONG (JULY 2, 1934)

**Family Life:** Andre Makong was born at Bambi on July 2, 1934 to the family of Mr. and Mrs. Ngouat Jacob. They are from the tribe of Bassa in Cameroon. He is the second son of his family, he has 4 brothers, and all are adults and parents. He has three sisters too. They are all members of the Seventh-day Adventist Church.

He got married to Bakongo Jeanne on July 21, 1960 in Ngambe (49 years ago). They have a grown up son who is very active in the Seventh-day Adventist church at Duala. He has been serving as an elder of the church since 1997.

**His Educational Background:** He attended the Protestant Primary School at Babimbi from 1943 to 1948, while from 1948 to 1950 he also attended the Adventist Primary School at Mandjap I Babimbi. He studied at the Adventist High School Nanga, Eboko from 1951 to1952.

He had his College Education from 1968 to 969 at Adventist Bible College of Niam Noudu and obtained an Evangelist's Certificate. Finally, he proceeded to the Adventist Seminary in Nanga, Eboko from 1969 to 1972 where he did Theological studies and also obtained an advanced Evangelist's Certificate

**His Conversion:** It was while studying in the Adventist Primary School at Mandjab I that he discovered the truth and became a Seventh-day Adventist in 1954.

His Ministerial Activities: He became a member of the preachers' team in 1958. He received his Official Credential as an authorized evangelist at Babimbi under the leadership of Pastors Assamba Pierre and Ekitike Adalbert. As an authorized evangelist he was posted to Duala-Boli. His field training was done under the supervision of Pastors Cupertino Elisee and Kurt Scheidegger from 1972-1974.

During his ministry as primary school teacher and Pastor, God used him to win souls to Christ. By God's grace, he conducted 54 great crusades in 36 towns in different parts of Central Africa. The flame is still shinning at Bamenda, RCA, Monrsal, Tchad, and Bafana. He was instrumental in the construction of a few church buildings. For example in Duala PK, Church was constructed through his selfless service and dedication to the work of God.
