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I WILL GO: CREATING LINKAGES WITHOUT COMPROMISE

The 2023 BU annual colloquium held between Jan 9 and 10, 2023 featured the Director and Deputy Director of the RIIC office in a presentation titled Creating Linkages with Compromise. The Director, of RIIC, Prof Grace Tayo while making her presentation encouraged faculty members to follow the example of the Godhead by collaborating with colleagues across departments and sister institutions for impactful research. The gains from such collaborations include better opportunities for funding, timely and efficient handling of tasks, efficient use of resources, and development of innovative solutions.

Prof Tayo. however cautioned that to avoid compromise, such collaborations should be with colleagues and institutions that share the core values and the philosophy of education of Babcock University.

Similarly, the Deputy Director, Dr Chinedu Anokwuru emphasized the need for faculty members to collaborate and conduct impactful research in the University's identified research niche (Environment, Food Safety Security and Adventist Heritage) in alignment with BU adopted SDG goals. According to him, research produces data "Data is King". He encouraged BU to adopt datadecision-making dependent approach.

OVERVIEW

The Research Methods Workshop which took place on the 23rd-26th of January 2023 had about 50 participants in attendance. Participants include the Provost, College of Post-graduate Studies, Prof. Aina Ayandiji, the Deputy Provost, College of Post-graduate Studies, Dr.Sokunbi Olutayo, two (2) representatives from each department, and all the research Office staff members.

The Director, RIIC, gave the opening remarks and emphasized the need for the workshop. A total of twenty-six (26) lectures were delivered by 8 facilitators:- Professor Adesola Olumide and Dr. Obioma Uchendu from the University of Ibadan, Dr. Akin Adebiyi, Dr. Olumide Abiodun, Dr. Lawal, Dr. Isaiah Abolarin, Dr. Sola Maitanmi, and Dr. Sodeinde from Babcock University. The highly interactive sessions covered sampling and analysis for qualitative and quantitative research. To identify methods, challenges, and prospects of various research methods in specialized areas, three (3) break-out sessions were held. A concluding general discussion was held to harmonize cross-cutting issues.

At the end of the sessions, participants saw the need to adopt appropriate research philosophies to maintain a high level of research integrity while planning and conducting research. The workshop was an eye-opener for participants to move away from research method stereotypes and to be more intentional about multi-disciplinary collaboration.

Concluding the workshop, Prof. Ayandiji who was present throughout the course of the workshop, charged attendees to dutifully implement what has been learned for the communal benefit of the University and society at large.
