I. TRANSLATIONAL RESEARCH IN MATERNAL AND PEDIATRIC PHARMACOLOGY AND THERAPEUTICS

The National Institute of Health (NIH) is pleased to announce call for Inter- and multi-disciplinary collaborations and interactions on Translational Research in Maternal and Pediatric Pharmacology and Therapeutics (R01 Clinical Trial Optional). The purpose of this funding opportunity announcement (FOA) is to encourage applications that will perform basic, translational and clinical research to (i) advance the understanding of underlying mechanisms of drug action; (ii) discover and develop novel therapeutics; (iii) enhance the usage of existing drugs or drug repurposing for safer and more effective treatment for pregnant women, lactating women, neonates and children. The overall goal is to improve drug safety and efficacy for maternal and pediatric precision therapeutics.
